# How to write an Exposé for a final BA/MA thesis in international relations<sup>1</sup>

The exposé with which you apply for a Bachelor or Master thesis supervision should give an overview of the following aspects of your project:

### 1. Problem formulation

What is your project about? What is the relevance of your problem to international relations? Why did you choose this topic?

## 2. Research question and hypothesis

What is the research question of your project? In what IR context can you locate your research question? Do you already have an idea on how to answer your question?

### 3. The current state of the art

What is the main literature for your thesis? What do you know about your topic? What is novel about your thesis project?

## 4. Type of thesis

What is the type of your thesis (e.g. analytical description, theory-driven empirical explanation)? See also the GSI Document "Five types of scientific papers" (in German).

### 5. Theory

On what theory/ies do you rely in your argument? Why did you choose this theory? What are alternative explanations?

#### 6. Method

What method(s) do you plan to use to answer your research question? Why did you choose this (these) method(s)? What other alternatives could be considered? In case your project goes beyond the analysis of secondary literature: what sources, documents, or data do you plan to use? How do you plan to analyse these?

Your exposé should not exceed two pages.
